5 **3. Approval of the Agenda**

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7 The draft agenda presented in contribution **OP-20050928-001** was reviewed and
8 approved as presented.
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10 **4. Contribution Assignment and Status**

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12 Other than the document register (**OP-20050928-000**) and the draft agenda (**OP-**
13 **20050928-001**) there were no further contributions noted for this meeting.
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15 **5. New Business**

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17 5.1 Future Evolution of 3GPP2
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19 The Organizational Partners were reminded of OP Action item 2005/06-03
20 in which each OP was to consider the future evolution of 3GPP2 in light
21 of the SC Chair's presentation at the June 2005 SC/OP meetings in Seoul.
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23 The TIA Head of Delegation offered the TIA position, noting that
24 OP-level discussions regarding the 3GPP2 scope and Systems Beyond
25 IMT-2000 are premature at this time; specification development work in
26 3GPP2 should continue relative to air interface evolution planned for
27 phase 1 and phase 2. However, if the scope impedes this work from
28 continuing in 3GPP2, then the TIA Delegation needs to reconsider this
29 issue.
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31 On behalf of ARIB, Kizuka-san noted two conclusions resulting from
32 ARIB discussion on this subject, namely:

- 33 - Systems beyond IMT-2000 are out of the scope of 3GPP2. Therefore,
34 the SC Chair's proposal should be examined only among the
35 Organizational Partners from a scope-related point of view. Such a
36 discussion is appropriate at the OP level but not at the Steering
37 Committee.
- 38 - As far as systems beyond IMT-2000, the ITU-R recommendation
39 M.1645 only identifies a framework. The ITU has yet to begin
40 discussing specific technologies or services.

42 Consequently, ARIB concluded that it was considered premature for
43 3GPP2 to consider an expansion of its scope into work beyond 3G, until
44 the conclusion and/or stabilization of ITU work on this subject. .

1 Both TTA and TTC noted that they support the position cited by both
2 ARIB and TIA.

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4 In the discussion that followed, it was further noted that nothing should
5 impede any of the work being planned in 3GPP2 and the work should
6 proceed on the evolution of cdma technology as being worked in 3GPP2
7 currently across all TSGs.

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9 Further, although it was noted that “systems beyond IMT-2000” is ITU
10 nomenclature and that, in the event that 3GPP2 work is not destined for
11 submission into the ITU, additional work can go ahead in 3GPP2 as
12 deemed appropriate, it was also noted that some OPs’ participation in the
13 ITU is directed by their particular governments and so any deviation from
14 the ITU path must be given careful consideration.

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16 Lastly, it was discussed that the SC Chair’s contribution that served as the
17 launch-pad for this OP discussion could either stay open at the SC level,
18 but on hold awaiting discussion pending the outcome of OP discussions
19 regarding the scope of 3GPP2 and Systems Beyond IMT-2000, or be
20 closed, and reopened at the appropriate time.

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22 There was no additional OP discussion on this topic. OPs agreed to revisit
23 this issue in Beijing at the end of October.

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25 **6. Any Other Business**

26 None noted.

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29 **7. Assignments for Next Meeting**

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31 No formal action items were assigned. OPs were encouraged to review the
32 current status of discussions and to continue discussion at the Beijing OP meeting.
